☐ Kwik stop or other styptic powder (stops bleed		
on nails)		

TOOLS & MATERIALS
Adhesive Tape
Cotton Balls
Absorbent Gauze (roll & pads)
Magnifying Glass
Disposable gloves
Q-Tips
Scissors (blunt tip)
Syringe, Eye Dropper & Bulb Syringe
Thermometer (Digital, rectal)
Towels & clean rags
Tounge depressors
Tweezers
Leash
Muzzle
Instant Cold Pack
Flash Light or Pen Light
Razor or Grooming Clippers
Epsom salt
Canned Pure Pumpkin (& can opener)
Glucose Paste or Syrup or Honey Packets

You will want to keep your items in a clear tote, clearly marked. A tote with a lid and handle work best. Gather your items before you purchase one to be sure you get the correct size.
